Church is facing a new reality. What does "normal" look like? This is a question churches across the world are struggling with. VPC leadership continually works to do all we can to keep you safe in the environment of worship as we live into this new reality. Some of the measures we continue to take for your safety are:

- 1. **Asking you to register for worship**. This is very important during our time of Pandemic. If you are struggling to register please call the church office for help. Your registration is important to Sunday morning. If at all possible we ask you to visit the web page at www.venciepres.org and register!
- Taking temperatures as you enter the building. We have not had to turn
 anyone away, praise God! Although this seems extreme to some we've
 learned that taking temperatures has prevented the outbreak in gatherings
 such as ours.
- 3. **Asking you to wear masks to worship.** Even though it is not required it is highly recommended. We have people on both sides of the spectrum when it comes to masks. We continue to ask for grace as each person must make the decision of wearing a mask based on their ability to do so. God is in control and will see us through.
- 4. We are no longer passing the offering plate but truly are grateful for the ways you are supporting God's church and mission to the community and world. We have offering boxes at each door, we offer online offering, and you can always mail in.

We continue to Glorify God in all we do even though we've had to change some of the ways we do things.

Session recently made the decision to not open campus to groups at this point. They prayerfully discerned that it is not the right time. Thank you for your understanding as we work through this unprecedented season.

You will read about big news in this issue! Burke Johnson has decided to retire at the end of 2020. Pastor Burke has been a vital part of VPC ministry and we will truly miss him. Trustee Update

The Trustees of Venice Presbyterian Church are very busy with many projects. Below is a list of projects being looked at as we continue to keep up with our facilities. There are many more projects as we work on general maintenance but we chose the following list as a way to inform you of ways the Trustees are stewarding the gift of facilities God has given us. Funding for these projects will come through a fund called Capital Improvements and designated gifts from the congregation.

- The Bell Tower has not worked in a few years. We would like to repair the bells to ring through the community once again. Cost: \$2,485
- While looking at the Bell Tower we also obtained a cost to pressure wash and paint the steel formation. Cost: \$3,600
- The parking lots could use a facelift. We would like to paint the curb stops and directional arrows to help you be able to more clearly see where to park. Cost: \$5,984
- We would like to replace the ceiling lights in Fellowship Hall with LED lighting to help conserve energy. Cost: \$10,540
- Other projects we are looking at that do not have costs attached are:
 - ♦ New ceiling tiles in Fellowship Hall
 - Outdoor signage to replace two rusted signs
 - ♦ Signage to identify buildings currently there is no place on our building that identify us as Venice Presbyterian Church.
 - ♦ Replace the roof on the Church House (Not an immediate need, planning for this one)
 - Enhancement of the Memorial Garden. If you have questions about any of these projects please feel free to contact any of the Trustees: Bob Allen, Mary Gregory, Richard Gilbert, Fred Francis, Jim Fullerton, Ann Stark, Chris O'Brien

Advent

The season of Advent begins on Sunday, November 29. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin Adventus, which means "coming" or "arrival." Advent is a season of expectant waiting and preparation. We look forward to the celebration of Christmas and the joyful remembrance of Christ's first coming to earth. We also look forward to Christ's second coming. And, maybe this year - with all of the challenges we've face in 2020 - our longing for Christ's return has only intensified.

We will be offering weekly video reflections during Advent. These Advent devotional videos will feature Scripture, a short meditation, and a musical reflection. They will be sent as our midweek videos during the season of Advent and Christmastide, inviting us all to pause in the middle of each week to worship our Savior and coming King.

Communion on the Lawn Celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

Join us outside on the front lawn of the church for a simple communion service. Bring a lawn chair and a loving heart as we gather together while social distancing. All safety protocols will be in place. Please register online on our website at www.venicepres.org. Wednesday, November 18, 9am

Communion Instructions for 1st Sunday of the month

As we've resumed in-person worship, we will also be resuming our practice of celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of each month. As a special provision during the COVID pandemic, those who worship from home are also invited to participate as an extension of our communion at the Lord's table

Those who would like to celebrate the sacrament of communion at home are invited to prepare in three specific ways:

- Prepare the communion bread: Place a cracker or a small piece of bread on a plate or napkin.
- Prepare the communion cup: The cup represents the blood of Christ, so grape juice or red wine would be ideal options to pour into a small glass or chalice.
- 3. Prepare your heart: This is the most important preparation any of us can make before celebrating the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. As the Presbyterian Directory for Worship describes: "Worshipers prepare themselves to celebrate the Lord's Supper by putting their trust in Christ, confessing their sin, and seeking reconciliation with God and with one another." (W-3.0409)

Please have the communion elements close at-hand before the worship service begins. When it's time for communion during the worship service, we will sing a hymn of preparation and then offer a Prayer of Thanksgiving. Next, pastors and elders (wearing masks and gloves) will individually hand a pre-packaged communion set to each worshipper in the sanctuary. Each safely-packaged communion set includes a small communion wafer sitting on top of a sealed cup of grape juice. During the distribution of the elements in the sanctuary, worshippers at home are encouraged to set out their bread and prepare the cup.

After the communion elements have been distributed in the sanctuary, a minister will offer the Words of Institution from 1 Corinthians 11:23-26, inviting worshipers (those in the sanctuary and those in the sanctuaries of their homes) to partake of the bread, and then the cup. As we traditionally do, we will conclude our communion service with a Prayer of Dedication, the Apostles Creed, and a closing hymn.



November MMP **HELPS International, Stove Team**

Thank-you for your support of your Guatemala stove team in this most unusual year. We want to bring you up to date on the status of your investment.

The week before our anticipated team departure on March 14th, 2020 was unsettling as we tried to make wise, informed decisions on the pandemic. On the morning of the 13th there were no reported cases of Covid-19 in Guatemala and only two in our county, making it seem unlikely that we would expose our team to the virus in Guatemala, or worse, that we would introduce the virus into Guatemala. But that evening everything changed when Guatemala confirmed its first case and immediately closed its borders. As we woke our team members to inform them of our cancellation, there was major disappointment and sadness. But the decision was appropriate and we were likely spared difficult consequences had we made it in.

We were the first of multiple stove and medical teams to cancel. What Helps did was bring together their in-country support staff to keep them employed installing the stoves. All of the families awaiting stoves and water filters received them.





Many of our team members from 2020 remain hopeful to return in 2021. Currently that looks doubtful but we will be prepared and again identify and raise money for specific families to receive stoves and water filters. Should circumstances improve, our tentative dates are March 13 - 22, 2021. If we are unable to install them as a team, Helps will again have staff do the installations. An important goal for Helps is to keep their staff employed through this crisis so these well trained employees will be ready to host medical and stove teams when it is safe for us to return.

Knowing the damage open fires do to lungs, and the danger of impure water, makes us realize how important it is to have these healthier alternatives for an even greater number of people thrown into poverty by the pandemic.

Thank-you for your faithfulness over the years supporting this ministry. We would like to assure you that any money collected goes directly to providing stoves and water filters for the families in the highlands of Guatemala.

December MMP Family Promise

Family Promise of South County is a faith-based, non-profit organization that enables the community to work together to address the needs of homeless children and families by providing temporary shelter, meals and comprehensive services to help them achieve lasting self-sufficiency.

We help families with children get back on their feet. Host congregations provide their facility for one week at a time-about once every three months. Families arrive at 5pm for dinner and stay overnight. During the day, kids go to daycare or school and parents go to work. On Sundays, the families move to the next host congregation site. Support congregations provide volunteer and financial support to host congregations.

We provide shelter, meals, basic needs (clothing, toiletries, personal items), case management, referrals and resources. All adults meet with an Employment Consultant (to assist in job seeking/



placement) and a **Financial Counselor** (to learn better management of finances and start a savings). We also provide them with a support system; volunteers who are there for them each day. Each adult, once working, must disclose all income to our Case Manager who then assists them in putting anywhere from 60% to 90% of their income into

a savings account. Once enough money is saved, we assist with local financial resources for the move, and families get back into housing. (We also assist with local resources for furniture and household items they will need.)
