# Quiet Space for Prayer and Meditation

Escaping the noise, I love to light a candle (which symbolizes the presence of Jesus, the Light of the World). Sometimes I enjoy listening to beautiful music. If I'm on my patio, I relish hearing the songs of the birds. But mostly, I savor the silence – inviting God to speak into my soul. It can be two minutes, ten minutes, or longer. But the quietness provides unmatched healing and hope for my heart.

## Reflecting on Philippians

It's interesting that God led us as a church family through an in-depth look at Paul's letter to the Philippians – an epistle written by a man who was in confinement, with words that resonate with "the peace of God that transcends understanding." It's worth revisiting Philippians: meditating chapter-by-chapter, or even committing to memory Philippians 4:6-7 (our church's verses for the year 2020).

# Reading the Psalms

Every part of Scripture is powerful. But I'm particularly enjoying the Psalms during this season. You may want to read a Psalm in the morning, and a Psalm in the evening. Any one of the 150 Psalms can minister to us, but here are 28 Psalms that may be particularly meaningful during this time of pandemic would be: Psalm 4, 16, 23, 27, 30, 31, 33, 34, 40, 46, 63, 71, 80, 86, 90, 91, 100, 103, 104, 113, 116, 118, 121, 124, 130, 139, 145, 147.

## **Praying With Hymns**

Find some of your beloved songs of faith. Turn them into prayers – either singing them in your home, or speaking the words from your heart. It's amazing how powerfully the music of our faith ministers to us during times of stress.

## Pray-As-You-Go


One of my longtime favorite on-line resources is Pray-As-You-Go, which offers daily readings of Scripture, complemented by beautiful music from around the world. These 10-12 minute daily devotionals are recorded by Christians from the United Kingdom. ### **YouVersion**

I'm grateful to my son for introducing me to this app, which I installed on my smart phone. You-Version provides many different tools - you can subscribe to a "Verse of the Day," follow a Bible-reading plan, look up a passage of Scripture, and more. They offer different short-term inspirational devotionals, for example a seven-day plan called "A Journey From Worry to Confident Hope: Praying Through the Lord's Prayer." You can find YouVersion on the App Store. It's totally free, and provides a treasury of inspiration at your fingertips.



### Reach Out & Touch Someone

Many of us remember the 1980's phone company TV ad: "Reach out and touch someone." Reaching out... caring for one another in tangible ways ... is of the most important things we can do as Christians during the social distancing of this coronavirus pandemic.

Jot down some names of people with whom you can connect... via phone call, text message, or email.

- Your neighbors, especially any who may be particularly isolated or lonely.
- Your family and friends let them know how much you care.
- The people who often sit near you in church. Reach out and let them know how much you miss seeing them; ask them how they are doing; and tell them you look forward to being together again when our times of gathered worship resume.

Don't wait for someone to reach out to you. We each need to take the initiative.

And when we do venture out in public, let's be sure to express kindness and gratitude to everyone we meet.

# Give Online (virtually anywhere and any time)

Giving online is safe and convenient. Realm (Real Ministry) offers new and easy ways to give financially to support our ministries. Whether you want to set up a recurring gift or split your donation among different funds, Realm makes it safe and secure to give online.

- Click the **Give Now** option on the top right corner of our website.
- 2. Enter your gift amount.
- 3. Give to the fund preselected for you or choose a different fund from the drop-down menu.
- 4. Enter your email address.
- 5. Select a frequency.
- 6. Click Give.

- 7. Choose your account type.
  - Credit/Debit Card \*the church is charged approximately 3.5% in processing fees.
  - Checking Account \*no processing fees for the church
- 8. Enter your payment information.
- Click **Give** to complete your donation.
- 10. You'll receive email confirmation of your gift.

- 1.Connect: This mobile app enables you to have Realm at your fingertips and stay connected to our church.
- 2. Search Connect in the app store.
- 3. Download the free app and sign in.
- 4. Tap the Giving icon at the bottom, tap Make a Gift and follow the prompts to give.

## **Electronic Funds** Transfer (EFT)

The church has a short form for you to fill out and sign.

Send form to the church with a cancelled check. We automatically withdraw your gift from the designated checking account on the 20th of each month.

Text Giving couldn't be easier and more secure. Text Giving provides multiple security layers for financial transactions and registration payments. To begin the process:

- 1. Text to: **73256**
- 2. Use Code: Venicepres
- 3. Type in the giving amount: **50** (insert your giving amount here)

It will take approximately 2 minutes to set up a payment method. Once the first text gift is processed, the payment method is saved for future contributions and allows for a faster and more convenient giving experience. When gifts are submitted through text, Venice Presbyterian Church will show in the confirmation text, payment form, and on the receipt.




## Our website, www.venicepres.org: Desktop, Mobile & Pads

Our website is also "mobile responsive" which means you can view it from your desktop, laptop and mobile devices and it will resize automatically for the appropriate device.

information and more. You must sign up to receive VPC emails. To sign up, go to the front page of our website and fill out the form. If you have been receiving emails, then you have already been added to our system.

The most common comment we get is that you didn't receive our emails. It is usually because our emails have gone to your "Spam" or "Junk" Folder. Once you open one of our emails, you're telling the system that you want to receive our emails, you should now receive them without them going to the spam folders.

We encourage you to open and read our emails to stay informed of church news. This is especially important now as thing are changing at a rapid pace.

## Video **Conferencing**

good for small groups.

With an enormous number of people social distancing as the world tries to curb the spread of corona virus. Zoom has become a kev tool for working from home, and a top choice for all kinds of virtual meetings. Zoom is a good choice for those interested in continuing small group bible studies due to its ease of use . stability and reliability. Zoom is also popular with family and friends as a way to stay connected as a group.

FaceTime is a video chat application developed by Apple. Face-Time remains available only to users of Apple products. Venice Presbyterian uses primarily Mac products. You can use FaceTime from your iPhone, iPad or Mac computer, and you'll need to be contacting someone on one of these devices as well as you can only talk to other Mac devices/users with it.

#### YouTube & Livestreaming

**YouTube** is a video sharing service where users can watch, like, share, comment and upload videos. The video service can

be accessed on PCs, laptops, tablets and via mobile phones. All of the churches videos are hosted on YouTube.

**Livestreaming** is the broadcasting of live videos to an audience over the internet. Unlike pre-recorded videos that can be cut and edited, livestreaming is just that – live and uncensored.

During this time of uncertainty, we continue to Livestream our Sunday services but they may occasionally be *pre-recorded*. We cannot predict future quarantine restrictions, therefore, we want to make sure the Sunday services continue to bring us together in worship. We continue to try creative ways to worship together and ask for grace during this time.

To get notified of new videos posted on YouTube, click on the Subscribe button and "Ring the Bell" to the right of the button.



**Facebook** is a social networking site that makes it easy for you to connect and share with family and friends online.

Venice Presbyterian Church has a Facebook page with basic information about

our worship services and events. We encourage you to reach out to us using the Facebook platform and let us know how you're doing during this time. Facebook encourages community interaction and we can come together using this platform to pray for one another and to check in with our neighbors and "friends".

We know this is the most popular platform for our congregation so we are looking to expand our Sunday services to include Facebook Live as well as, YouTube Livestreaming. This requires some additional licensing but we are hopeful that this can be implemented quickly.

The word app is a short for "application." Application in this case refers to a software application — in other words, an app is a software program.

An app typically refers to software used on a smartphone or mobile device such as the Android, iPhone, BlackBerry or iPad, as in "mobile app" or "iphone app."
