Philippians 4:4-7⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!⁵ Let your gentleness be evident to all. The



Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

We have heard this scripture after every Wednesday update, during worship, and ending many prayers. God's goodness is near. As we begin to reopen our doors to our community we are reminded of how important corporate worship is to our souls. God chose this type of weekly celebration not by accident, but to be a community of believers celebrating together kingdom life.

The State of Florida plans to reopen in three phases.

Phase One: Strict social distancing guidelines will remain in place. People

are encouraged to wear masks in public. Vulnerable individuals* should continue to shelter in place. Group of 10 or less may gather

if social distancing is respected.

Phase Two: Moderate social distancing guidelines will be in effect. Vulnerable

individuals* should remain sheltered in place. Groups of 50 or less

may gather if social distancing is respected.

Phase Three: Vulnerable individuals* may resume activity with precautions.

Low-risk individuals should consider minimizing time spent in

crowded environments.

Phased reopening is based upon:

Symptoms: Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses or covid-19 like

syndromic cases reported

Cases: Downward trajectory of documented cases for 14 days or down-

ward trajectory of positive tests as a total tests for 14 days

Hospitals: Treat all patient without crisis cases AND robust testing program in

place for at-risk healthcare workers, including emerging anti body

testina.

*Vulnerable individuals — elderly individuals, individuals with underlying health conditions, including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma, and those whose immune system is compromised such as a by chemotherapy for cancer and other conditions requiring such therapy (Information from whitehouse.gov)



March Mission Partner, Day 4 Hope

More than 130 children in the Venice area are homeless. They don't have a nice home, can't visit a fine restaurant, or have travel possibilities. They live in a car, motel or homeless camp. They dine on scraps or fast food. They travel by bike or walk since they don't have any other means of travel. Their clothes are not clean or new but hand-me-downs or from Goodwill. They're not able to wash in a nice bathroom. And more than 1,000 people continue to move to Florida every day, some of whom are in these same circumstances.

For the last four years, VPC with Day 4 Hope, has sponsored approximately 120 homeless children per year to prepare them to return to school with new clothes, new shoes, haircut, medical exam, eye exam, dental exam, new backpack filled with school supplies, books, hygiene products and groceries for them and their family – all at no cost to the child or family.





Hope 4 Communities and Day 4 Hope started in 2010, serving 250 children in Sarasota. Last year VPC served 116 children from four schools: Venice Elementary, Garden Elementary, Laurel Nokomis Elementary, and Taylor Ranch Elementary. Countywide, 2,865 children were served. This year we hope to serve 130 children here at VPC and over 3,000 county-wide. VPC will serve homeless children from eight schools, the same four from last year plus Englewood Elementary, Sky Academy Venice, Sky Academy Englewood and the Montessori school on Pinebrook.

Day 4 Hope, July 25, 9 AM - 2 PM

How do you accomplish a Day 4 Hope to serve 125 children and their families and maintain healthy distancing and not touch the kids? You cannot! COVID-19 has totally changed the way we will accomplish Day 4 Hope this year: a drive-through only with no touching and healthy distancing. Plus, in communicating with the school counselors the need has radically grown from last year where we served about 125 kids, this year we will serve 215 kids.

Because of COVID-19, we have had to reduce the process to the basics, which means we will provide only the backpack full of school supplies, care bag

with hygiene products and hopefully groceries from All Faiths Foodbank and fruit and vegetables from Detwiler's, plus three gift cards (for clothes and shoes) per child. We have created a safety protocol to protect the team members from the vehicle occupants picking up the supplies and between team members. Since the event will happen on July 25th, a hot humid day, between 9:00 AM and 2:00 PM, we are asking for help from the teenagers to carry the goods to the cars. We will continue to show God's love and care for those less fortunate and your generosity has created the funds to accomplish this event.

Also, our friends at Grace United Methodist Church have stepped up to sponsor children again this year. Please pray for the Day 4 Hope team as we make final preparations.

Habitat South Sarasota is part of a global, nonprofit housing organization operating on Christian principles that seeks to put God's love into action by bringing people together to build homes, communities, and hope.

Habitat for Humanity offers the dream of home ownership to those who would otherwise not be able to afford a home of their own. The new homeowners actually help build the house alongside many dedicated volunteers in the community. Habitat sells the house to the homeowner at cost and finances the mortgage at a zero interest rate.

Habitat for Humanity South Sarasota County, Inc. is part of a global, nonprofit housing organization operating on Christian principles that seeks to put God's love into action by bringing people together to build homes, communities and hope. Habitat for Humanity builds affordable homes for low-income partners in South Sarasota County. Since 1992 they have



rehabilitated and/or built over 100 homes, housing over 325 local residents with over 200 of them being children.

Habitat South Sarasota partner families work side by side with community volunteers for a required 300 "sweat equity" hours to build safe, decent affordable houses. They must attend 8 two-and-a-half hour homeowner classes. and 1 eight-hour HUD certified "First Time Homebuyer Workshop". Individuals become homeowners through our program reducing their dependence on community, social and

financial services. These are substantial benefits for those individuals and particularly positive for the next generation.

Every year, Habitat for Humanity Sarasota relies on more than 800 volunteers to support our mission. Volunteers help keep the homes affordable for qualified homebuyers. It is our goal to help you find the volunteer assignment that best suits your skills, interests, and schedule.

Volunteer on the construction of a new home or help with a home renovation. A half-day commitment (7:30 am – 12:00 pm) is required and we build on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday each week. Weekday volunteers are our greatest need. Must

The mission of the Community Assistance Ministry (C.A.M.) is to meet the urgent needs of the residents of Venice and Nokomis, FL and the homeless, with dignity and respect. Many of those served find themselves in the situation of having to decide between paying rent or putting food on the table for their family. Through food donations from the community, church members, and various "food partners" from whom we purchase food at a discount, we do what we can to make their choice a little easier.

C.A.M. also believes that the spiritual and emotional needs of their guests must be met, as well as the physical. To help meet these needs they have Stephen Ministers on site to offer prayer, support, and counseling.

C.A.M. provides the indigent in our area with a place they can come to that is safe and offers fellowship and a sense of community. They are treated with dignity and respect, are given a hot lunch, food to take home and an opportunity to interact in a meaningful way with Stephen Ministers.

C.A.M. provides a hot lunch Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, as well as food to take home (enough to prepare 3 meals a day for 9 days). As well as limited financial assistance when available.

C.A.M. is manned by numerous dedicated and compassionate individuals who give freely of their time each week. With only one part time paid staff member it is essential to have committed volunteers. There are volunteer positions for everyone who wants to serve.

That her dad is being allowed to work from home next week after his furlough of two months. That my sister's family is managing all right and her husband is still fighting his cancer valiantly with new treatments. That some of her grandchildren are able to get jobs.

Neighbors who can't stop cooking and bring extras to us.

Receiving old snapshots of childhood from relatives that they found while cleaning things out.

Having our garden share wonderful things for us in the kinds of birds that we don't always have, an osprey nest in a neighbor's tree, hummingbirds and many others besides, the butterfly population that grows, the many plants and flowers that show us God's beauty.

But one thing that stands out for me is that the internet is alive with Email. People all over the country I don't write to often, though they are good friends and relatives, are in touch, sending funny jokes and pictures so we can all have a laugh. Comparing our inabilities to see our doctors or go out to eat or whatever. No one is in really bad humor about it all. It is a wait it out, this too shall pass kind of thing.

Ten Days of Prayer

Day 1, BEGINNING TEN DAYS OF PRAYER

SCRIPTURE

Acts 1:12-14

OBSERVE

Forty after the Resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven. Prior to his ascension, Jesus told the disciples not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for the Holy Spirit: "In a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5).

For the next ten days, the disciples "joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and Jesus' brothers" (Acts 1:14). The women probably included those who went to the tomb on Easter and other women who had followed Jesus. The Bible indicates that Jesus had brothers (Matthew 12:46, Mark 3:31, Luke 8:19). All these followers of Jesus waited, as their Master had told them, for something more wonderful than they could imagine. And as they waited, they devoted themselves to prayer.

APPLY

Jesus promised the baptism of the Holy Spirit. The Bible teaches that all who are in Christ have the Holy Spirit, and that we are to be filled again and again with the Holy Spirit in our daily lives (Ephesians 5:18). The Holy Spirit was poured out on the Day of Pentecost. And at times throughout history, God has graciously given fresh outpourings of the Spirit – often known as times of revival or "great awakenings." A common theme of

these great revivals is that they are often born in prayer – as God's people devote themselves to praying, seeking God, and asking the Lord to send a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Could this be another time when God is preparing to send revival and spiritual awakening to His people? What do you imagine a time of awakening to look like? What might it look like in our church – and in the world?

PRAY

For Yourself

 Pray for your own need of more of the Holy Spirit in your life.

For VPC

 AUDIO-VISUAL TECHNOLOGY: Give thanks for the technology that has allowed us to remain connected during this pandemic. Pray for the continued use of technology - that nothing would keep people from hearing the Gospel and being able to worship with others in the Body of Christ during this time of separation. Pray for the AV system and the whole team of staff and volunteers who offer their talents so that our ministry can continue and expand over the internet - that we might proclaim the Good News beyond our congregation to people all over the world!

For the Global Church



Day 2, THIRST

SCRIPTURE

John 7:37-39

OBSERVE



Jesus proclaims that the day is coming – when the Holy Spirit of God will not only dwell with God's people, but will dwell within God's people.

And our Lord indicates that a pre-condition for being filled with the Holy Spirit is to be thirsty: "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink." (Luke 7:37)

APPLY

What's my level of spiritual thirst these days? Beyond wanting to be able to go to church again, and to resume some semblance of "normal" life, how much am I thirsting for the "streams of living water flowing within" that Jesus promises?

What might it look like when a church is really thirsting for these streams of living water? What might it look like when people are really filled with these streams of living water? What might it look like for me to be filled these streams of living water?

PRAY

For Yourself

 Pray for God to fill you with more thirst for the Holy Spirit – with a longing to be filled the streams of living water.

For VPC

 THE PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S WORD: Pray for the preaching ministry of VPC, that all who prepare and speak messages will be filled with the Holy Spirit as they earnestly study God's Word and rely on God's strength. Pray that every message glorifies God, exalts Jesus, and carries the power of the Spirit. Pray that listeners would have their hearts tuned to what God would have them hear, and that the preaching of VPC would always be faithful to the Scriptures and draw people closer to Christ.

For the Global Church

• Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on the church in Asia.





Day 3, EXPECTANCY

SCRIPTURE

Ephesians 3:14-21

OBSERVE

Paul prays for the church at Ephesus. What details do you notice about Paul's prayer? Notice especially the final note of incredible expectation (verse 20): "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is work within us ..."

Wow! What a powerful expression of expectation! What an affirmation of God's power!

APPLY

How might God be calling me to have a greater sense of expectancy in my life? How can I be praying for our church with greater expectancy – instead of just feeling like "things never change"?

PRAY

For Yourself

- Pray for that we would grow in our expectancy for the Lord to move in our lives.
- · Give thanks for what we have seen God do in the past

For VPC

 FAMILY MINISTRIES: Pray for the Kingdom impact that VPC can have with children, youth, and their families. Pray that God would continue to awaken spiritual hunger and thirst in the families in our community. Pray that God would continue strengthening and encouraging all who serve in our ministries with the next generations.

For the Global Church

 Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on churches in Australia and the South Pacific.



Day 4, REPENTANCE

SCRIPTURE

Acts 2:36-41

OBSERVE

This passage is the conclusion of Peter's epic sermon on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:14-41). Sometimes we flinch about the whole subject of "repentance," because we don't like to remind ourselves or others that we disregard God's Word, disobey God's will, and need a change of direction in our lives. Repentance means changing our direction – turning away from the paths that only lead to emptiness, and turning towards life in the Spirit.

A common characteristic of the great spiritual awakenings and revivals in history is the widespread awareness by people of their need for repentance. This longing for repentance began in churches – as Christians acknowledged the many ways they were not living fully for Christ.

APPLY

Where are the areas of my life where I need to recognize my own personal need for repentance? In what ways am I continuing to go in directions that lead to emptiness?

PRAY

For Yourself

- Pray for personal areas of your life which need to be brought to the Lord in confession
- Pray that God would reveal areas which need to be confessed
- Pray that you will rejoice in God's mercy and forgiveness, and open yourself to new directions and dimensions of life in the Holy Spirit.

For VPC

WORSHIP AND MUSIC MINISTRIES:
 Pray that people's hearts would be refreshed and inspired to deeper praise of God through the Sunday worship livestream and Jamal's new "Music and the Word" broadcasts.
 As we wait for the return to in-person worship, pray that God would make a way for worshippers to express their heart-felt praise to God; and that every person and every generation would come to worship God in Spirit and in truth.

For the Global Church

 Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on churches in Australia and the South Pacific.



Day 5, SURRENDER

SCRIPTURE

Matthew 16:24-25

OBSERVE

These words of Jesus are probably words we've heard many times before ... maybe so often, that the force of what Jesus saying has become blunted. Jesus invites his followers to take up a cross. Jesus is, of course, pointing to his own cross. But he's also employing the idea of crucifixion to emphasize the painfulness of surrendering things for a greater glory.

APPLY

What are things, habits, and attitudes in my life that get in the way of my transformation in Christ?

It's OK to acknowledge the painfulness of letting go of these barriers to abundant life. Many of these things have helped us cope with pain and disappointment. Sometimes the hardest part of the Christian life is not letting go of bad things for the sake of better things; it's letting go of good things in order to receive God's BEST.

PRAY

For Yourself

- Pray that God will show you what things are getting in the way of abundant life in Christ and the Holy Spirit.
- Pray for the courage, strength, and resolve to surrender the things that hinder fullness of life in God.

For VPC

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP. Pray with thanksgiving to God for His faithfulness in providing ample financial resources for VPC's operating needs and our mission partners during this season of COVID-19. Pray that every person in VPC would live with wonder and gratitude for Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, and that the awareness of God's mercy would inspire us to live with open hands that give instead of clenched fists that horde. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill every member of our congregation with the spiritual fruit of generosity – that God will be glorified in ways yet to be imagined!

For the Global Church

 Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on churches in Latin America and the Caribbean.



Day 6, ASK

SCRIPTURE

Luke 11:9-13

OBSERVE

Jesus offers this teaching about asking and seeking in the context of a larger lesson about prayer (Luke 11:1-13). Jesus stresses that our Heavenly Father is eager to give us good gifts when we ask in faith — specifically, God will give us more of the Holy Spirit when we ask him (Luke 11:12). Building on Jesus' teaching, the New Testament epistle of James instructs: "You have not, because you ask not" (James 4:2).

APPLY

What is my experience of asking for things (from parents, relatives, friends, teachers, employers)? How might my personal experiences of asking and receiving (or not receiving) be impacting my approach to prayer?

How much do I ask God for more of the Holy Spirit in my life? Do I really believe that if I ask, God will give me the Holy Spirit? Am I willing and eager to ask, to seek, to knock?

PRAY

For Yourself

- Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you, and to move in your life.
- Ask for more of the specific fruit that the Spirit produces (Galatians 5:22-23): more love, more joy, more peace, more patience, more kindness, more generosity (goodness), more faithfulness, more gentleness, more self-control.

For VPC

 PRAYER: Pray for God to fill the people of VPC with a greater hunger for prayer and a more passionate desire to pray.

For the Global Church

Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on the church in the Middle East. As
we pray for this region of the world, pray for the peace of Jerusalem (Psalm
122:6).

Day 7, HOPE

SCRIPTURE

Romans 15:13

OBSERVE

What a blessing for us and for our world in this time of the coronavirus: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy

and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Paul offers this benediction as he's concluding his letter to the Romans. It's an epistle filled with Gospel hope. In the verse immediately preceding, Paul quotes Isaiah 11:10 to announce how the Good News is expanding beyond Judaism to include all the peoples on earth: Jesus (from the Root of Jesse) "will arise to rule over the nations; the Gentiles will hope in him."

APPLY

How might God be working in this pandemic to bring Gospel hope to people all over the world? Specifically, how might we (the church) best demonstrate our hope in the midst of this worldwide crisis – and in our everyday interactions in our homes and among people with whom we're in contact?

PRAY

For Yourself

 Pray this verse (Romans 15:13), making it personal for you: "God of hope, fill me with all joy and peace as I trust in you! Make me overflow with hope by the power of your Holy Spirit!"

For VPC

 CARING MINISTRIES: Pray for all those giving care to those who are hurting – pastors, Stephen Ministers, Shepherds, small group leaders, and members who are reaching out in compassion to one another. Pray that God will fill them with inextinguishable hope as they trust in the God of hope. Pray that VPC will overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

For the Global Church

• Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on the church in North America.

Day 8, OBEDIENCE

SCRIPTURE

John 14:15-27

OBSERVE

Jesus offers this teaching about obedience in the context of his "Farewell Discourse" that John remembered from the Last Supper (Luke 13-17). This particular



section (14:15-27) begins with the straightforward statement: "If you love me, you will obey what I command." Jesus reinforces the importance of obedience throughout this passage, reminding the disciples (and us) that his words are not merely human teaching, but divine instruction from heaven. Jesus indicates that the Holy Spirit will enable us to live in obedience to Christ by reminding us of what Jesus said (John 14:26) and by guiding us into all truth (John 16:13). We need the Holy Spirit to lead us in the way of obedience that brings life.

APPLY

Evan Roberts, a prominent preacher during the Welsh Revival (1904-05), said that one sign of spiritual awakening is people recognizing their need to obey the Holy Spirit. When we are earnestly seeking to walk in step with the Holy Spirit, we cherish the Word of God – because the Holy Spirit guides us into all truth.

Much or modern and post-modern culture suggests that morality can vary from person to person, and that many principles of Scripture no longer apply in today's world. What might be some ways that I wrestle with obedience to Christ and the Scriptures – preferring instead to be guided by popular opinion or my own sense of right/wrong?

PRAY

For Yourself

 Pray that your will would be in tune with the Holy Spirit's, so that you will walk easily in obedience to God's Word day-by-day.

For VPC

 LEADERSHIP. Pray for the leadership of VPC – the Session, the Board of Trustees, the Staff, all leaders of ministries and committees. If you don't know all their names, simply pray for as many leaders as you can remember. As today we are praying for more obedience, pray specifically that the leadership of VPC will always remain obedient to Christ and to the truth of Scripture.

For the Global Church

• Pray for the Holy Spirit to fall afresh on the church in South America.

Day 9, WITNESS

SCRIPTURE

Acts 1:8

OBSERVE

These are the last words of Jesus' earthly ministry that are recorded by Luke. Jesus proclaims that the disciples will receive the power of the Holy Spirit, and that they will be His witnesses. Jesus also lays out the far-reaching power of the Gospel, which will begin in Jerusalem, the go into all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

The word translated as "witnesses" comes from the Greek word marturas – from which we derive the word "martyr." We might feel OK about becoming a witness for Jesus – but a martyr?

Witnessing is high-stakes service for the Kingdom of God. Witnessing means not only speaking about Christ – but demonstrating with our whole life that we belong to Christ. Witnesses for our Lord Jesus Christ are empowered by the Holy Spirit, and filled with boldness and courage to share the life- changing Good News of the Gospel. With such power at work within us, why should we be hesitant or afraid?

APPLY

All of us who follow Jesus are His witnesses. Yes, some people have a particular gifting for evangelism. But every Christ-follower is called to be a witness — to share the Gospel hope that is within us (1 Peter 3:15). With whom have I shared my hope in Jesus? Whose life has been blessed to know Jesus in a more genuine, personal way through me? Consider these questions — not for the sake of boasting ... nor to feel guilty if it's hard for you to answer these questions.

As you reflect on Acts 1:8, don't lose sight of the fact that we are called to witness in the power of the Holy Spirit, and that

- in the Spirit's power, and trusting that the Spirit is already at work ahead of us - Jesus



promises that we will be his witnesses. We won't be embarrassed, or intimidated, or fearful. God will bless the ways we witness through the power of the Holy Spirit!

PRAY

For Yourself

- Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal specific people for whom you can be a witness.
- Pray for the continuing empowerment of the Holy Spirit to guide you as you share the hope of Jesus.

For VPC

MISSIONS: Pray for the mission partners
of VPC who are witnesses of Jesus
Christ in our community and around
the world. If you do not remember all of
VPC's specific mission partners, pray for
as many as you can recall. (Our mission
partners are listed on the VPC website,
if you feel called to seek out this
information so you can continue praying
for them.) Pray that missionaries and
mission partners would receive fresh
power and encouragement from God,
and their Kingdom impact would grow
for God's glory.

For the Global Church

 Pray for the Holy Spirit to sustain and fall afresh on Christians who are persecuted across the globe.

Day 10, COME, HOLY SPIRIT!

SCRIPTURE

Acts 2:1-41

OBSERVE

Jews from many nations were gathered in Jerusalem for the Feast of Pentecost – an annual celebration marking the spring harvest, thanking God for providing the food that is needed for life. The city of Jerusalem was packed with pilgrims attending the Feast. The disciples had been praying for the past ten days, waiting in the city as Jesus had instructed (Acts 1:4).

When the Holy Spirit came as Jesus had promised, people began miraculously speaking (and being understood) in different languages. When the Spirit falls afresh, amazing things can happen!

Peter teaches from the Scriptures that what is happening had been prophesied by Joel. And the point of this dramatic manifestation of the Holy Spirit – indicates Peter – is to draw people's attention to Jesus as the Savior of the world.

APPLY

You may want to re-read this passage of Scripture - reading it slowly ... vividly imagining the awe of Pentecost ... imagining the sound of different languages, and the wonder and delight of people hearing their own native tongues being spoken ... imagining the preaching of Peter, now transformed from an impetuous fisherman into a mighty witness ... imagining 3000 people baptized in one day! As you conclude these ten days of praying, consider beginning a new commitment to pray. Continue praying for more of the Holy Spirit in your life, in our church, and in the church around the world. Consider how you might continue praying with enthusiasm for revival – never forgetting that revival begins with God's work in each of us

PRAY

For Yourself

 Pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit



into your life. You may want to sing: "Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me. Melt me, mold me, fill me, use me. Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me!"

For VPC

 CONNECTION GROUPS – Pray that every member of VPC would find connection with other believers in the church family - and that, particularly during this time of social isolation. individuals would remain as connected as possible. Pray that a sense of connection would even deepen among our church family - even while we are physically apart. Pray that all connection groups would experience the "streams of living water" of the Holy Spirit as they gather together. Pray that our life together would more and more reflect the Spirit-filled fellowship of the early church (Acts 2:42-47).

For the Global Church

 Pray for the church across the globe – beginning with God's churches in the Venice community. We've experienced a pandemic that's affected nations all around the world. Pray that God will revive the church all over the world, sending a pan- awakening that will draw people of every nation, tribe, people and language to our Lord Jesus Christ!
