Desk of Executive Director

God is at work in many beautiful ways, as we remain a prayerful, Christ-centered, Bible-teaching church. It continues to be an honor to serve Venice Presbyterian Church.

We are enhancing our buildings and grounds through the generous match many of you joined at the end of 2020.

Recently the parking lot facelift was completed. It is very easy to see where to

park, even in the grassy areas! There are new arrows painted on the ground and the handicapped parking spaces are well marked. The next step will be to improve all signage on campus. Currently we do not have our buildings marked well. That will change shortly when we add signs.

Fellowship Hall is getting a bit of a facelift. Early in January we found some black mold in the ductwork. We immediately blocked off the room and had the air tested for quality. Thankfully there were no harmful particles found in the air but we needed to clean up the mold and the mess. You will notice new ceiling tiles in the room



but under the ceiling tile there is also new insulation, new ductwork, and a much cleaner area. The Building Enhancement match paid for this.

Also, **for those watching online** we've created a survey to help us better understand your experience. It will be available in the YouTube chat box, the



weekly email and on our website. I would encourage you to send us your thoughts and in return, receive an in-home worship gift.

We will hold a **work day April 14**th to clean, move, re-organize, paint and make the space fresh to welcome Family Promise to our campus. All safety protocols will be in place including masks and social distancing. **We really need people in the areas of moving bins, cleaning, painting, and sprucing up the area**. 

What's Happening in the A/V Booth?

It seems the A/V booth has been undergoing constant changes over the last 12 months! We have been blessed with new equipment, furniture, and, most importantly, volunteers. We are so thankful for the many dedicated servants who make it possible for you to experience worship each Sunday. We are blessed with top of the line equipment, but without people it would not run. Make sure you say 'Thank you' to these folks when you see them on Sundays.

It takes between 4-6 volunteers at each service in order to run the camera, lights, audio, live streaming, screens, and more. That makes up to 12 positions to fill each Sunday! Each month there is a master schedule that is sent out to all of the volunteers asking them to accept dates and positions for the following month.

While there are positions that take more training and experience, there

are also several positions that can be easily learned in less than an hour. Even though the jobs vary in difficulty, it's important to have someone focused on each task during a service to ensure that cues are followed correctly and on time.

At each service there is a 'producer' whose job is to oversee all of the tasks. The producer is making small adjustments in all of the areas. If we run into any problems, the producer is an extra hand to run a mic to the front, restart a computer, or complete any troubleshooting that needs to happen at any given moment. If a volunteer is unsure of their cues or has technical problems never fear! The producer is there to guide us through the day.

Family Promise Moves to the Family Life Center!



God is at work in a very big way at Venice Presbyterian Church! The Trustees and Session would like to announce a long term Building Use Agreement we have recently entered into with one of our Mission Partners, **Family Promise of Sarasota County**. Family Promise will move its administrative offices and Open Door Program to the Family Life building beginning May 1. The Bridge Housing (shelter) will remain at the Shamrock Road location. This means Family Promise will house its administrative offices, board meetings, counseling, and educational services at the Family Life building on our campus. As Gail Thompson said at our Session meeting, "This is a God thing." Gail met with Session in March, as a guest, to affirm the partnership. Family Promise had been looking for space for a couple of years and "all the pieces just fell together," said Gail. Gail is the ministry coordinator for Venice Presbyterian Church and Family Promise. We are all very excited to welcome Family Promise to our campus!

South County Food Pantry Matching Donation Program

The Louis and Gloria Flanzer Philanthropic Trust has announced that their Matching Donation Program will be extended through 2021!

During 2020, this Matching Program has distributed \$3.145 million to agencies in Sarasota, Manatee, Charlotte and DeSoto counties.

Contributions between \$5 and \$500 will be matched at 100%.

The goal of South **County Food Pantry is** to provide temporary food support to individuals and families by gathering, organizing and distributing food. This is accomplished by 120 VOLUNTEERS and during 2020 with COVID-19 they were able to stay open under strict quidelines. During this time they processed approximately \$200,000 in food donations and

provided food assistance to approximately 800 adults and children MONTHLY.

Due to your generosity and that of others in the community, The Pantry has been able to increase the types and guality of food provided to clients. In November, 300 turkeys were distributed. Publix gift cards and Christmas stockings were given out in December. While schools were closed last Spring, donations to the Giving Challenge allowed them to provide a \$25 Publix gift card to each child and provide bags of special "kid-friendly" food to each family.

Grandparents Corner

Passing on faith to our grandkids is our duty before God. He commands us as grandparents to teach two generations, not just one. One of the greatest examples of a grandparent's influence is found in 2 Timothy 1:5 where Paul observes that Timothy's sincere faith was passed down from his grandmother, Lois.



Grandparents can make a difference in the lives of their grandchildren, but intentional Christian grandparents can make an incredible difference. If you desire to impact the lives of your grandkids, there are many ways we can impact the lives of our children and grandchildren. These principles are finding a home in the hearts of Christian grandparents who desire to leave a deep spiritual imprint in their families. If you are not already, become intentional—and let them find a home in yours.

Understand Your Impact Potential

Grandpa or grandma, you are second only to parents in your potential to influence your grandkids spiritually.

If you haven't thought about your impact potential before, you're not alone. Many Christian grandparents are missing important



opportunities because they haven't seen the possibility—nor the responsibility—that grandchildren bring. We rightly see parents as first both in responsibility and potential to impact the spiritual growth of children. Then, we see children's workers in church as second. But even for church-going families, children's workers are not second. Neither are youth pastors, or Christian school teachers. You, grandparents, are second in impact potential.

The influence of these others can be significant, but it is generally short-lived; yours is for as long as God gives you breath. These others say they love children, but not like you love your grandkids. They have some spiritual wisdom to impart; you have a lifetime to share. They "do church" together with children and youth. You "do life" together with them. Do you see, grandparents? You are ideally positioned for great influence and spiritual impact.

Some Christian grandparents, though, are not the number two spiritual influencer; in reality, they are number one. When grandparents have custody or are the primary caregivers, they're number one. When parents are cool toward spiritual things or worse, the grandparents are often the only ones in a child's life committed to faith impact.

Grandparent, you can leave a deep impression on the souls of your grandkids. You are in a unique role—a God-given role, that He wants you to fulfill. The potential is there: God can use you and He will use you if you make yourself available.

Jesus' Passion Week for Children

Over the Easter season, each of our regularly attending children received a copy of **The Donkey Who Carried a King**. This book vividly brings home the biblical teaching that Jesus was the Suffering Servant who carried the sins of His people when He went to the cross. This book was authored by the late Dr. R.C Sproul, respected theologian, author, and educator.

Davey was a young donkey who was bored and unhappy because he was never given anything to do. Then one



day, some strangers came to the gate - and Davey's master picked him for a very special task. Davey carried the King, Jesus, into Jerusalem. A few days later, Davey saw some angry people making the King carry a heavy beam of wood. Davey could not understand it - until another donkey helped him see that the King was being a Servant on behalf of His people. The Donkey Who Carried a King offers a unique perspective on the events of Jesus' Passion Week and calls all believers, both young and old, to follow in the footsteps of the Suffering Servant for the glory of God. Jesus was willing to leave the glories of heaven to suffer and die in this world on our behalf, so we should serve Him with all our hearts.

A great feature of this book are the questions and answers to help families understand and apply the truths taught in its pages. This book is highly recommended for your kids and grandkids!




