It is an honor and privilege to share with you that all documents that need to be submitted to the State of Florida reflecting the changes to the Articles of Incorporation for Realty Holdings, Inc. and Venice Presbyterian Church Foundation, Inc. have been notarized and are in the process of being filed. This is a historic time for VPC because these documents clarify the corporations, protect VPC from litigation, and create a Foundation that will bless the community at large. The first distribution from the Foundation to Habitat for Humanity happened at the Annual Meeting. We continue to discuss the Faith Built house Habitat will build using these funds. We will share with you the ways you can be involved in not only the build but the ground breaking. Right now you can be praying for the family that will soon occupy their new home. Glory be to God for this opportunity.

Since the Annual Meeting I've had questions as to how to give to the Foundation. If that is a desire in your heart, please make a check out to Venice Presbyterian Church Foundation. We will get it to the investment firm for deposit. Please know the church general fund is still extremely important. Your offering to the general fund allows us to continue doing God's work. Gifts to the

Foundation would hopefully be a gift above and beyond what you give to the church. This could be a legacy of your love for God and the community.

You also heard the announcement about the dollar-for-dollar match campaign in church November 22. It is incredible to have a donor who would fund this type of opportunity two years in a row! Praise be to God from whom all blessings flow.

Some of the plans for this dollar for dollar match are to enhance the landscaping of the property, replace the flat roofs of the Church House and Administration Building which are leaking and old. We also plan to paint the Church House and add new signage to the campus at the street level.

Your gifts from last year replaced the elevator in the Administration Building, sealed and painted the parking lot, painted the curb stops, replaced the roof on the Administration Building, and replaced the carpet in the chapel to name a few of the much needed projects of the church.

We worship in God's house. Your gifts help us maintain that house and we are grateful.

November first thru the third we were able to host a Transforming Church Retreat for Session. This was a virtual retreat based on the Transforming Center that Pastor

Chris. Pastor Carolyn, Jamal and I attended and finished this year. It was a time of growth both spiritually and relationally as we brought a group of people together who now know each other better, know God more deeply, and are better equipped to help move VPC forward in this season of ministry. One Session member shared "this was a life changing experience", another felt more capable of making decisions that would "glorify God and transform hearts for Christ". We are in an exciting season of ministry at VPC and the opportunity to attend this retreat enhanced the leadership in wavs words cannot describe. This was made possible by a gift for leadership training received through a designed gift.



Two Services Begin Sunday, January 9

Get to know VPC's New Interim Choir Director

I was born in Lansing, Michigan and spent most of my growing up years in the Chicago suburb of Lombard. Illinois. My wife, Cindy, and I met in seventh grade math class. We both graduated from Wheaton College, getting married a week before we received our diplomas. Cindy taught grade school while I completed a Masters degree in music at Indiana University. Then we both enjoyed travelling for about 20 years as I was blessed with opportunities to sing with opera companies and symphony orchestras around the world. That was enough constant travel for me though, and I was happy to accept a position at the University of Denver Lamont School of Music, Lserved as the director of the opera theater program and chair of the vocal arts department for 19 years before retiring and moving to Venice. My choral work has been as choirmaster at the Cherry Creek Presbyterian Church in Denver and continuing as the choir director at the Congregational Summer Assembly just north of Frankfort, Michigan. Both of these groups have inspired me in my walk of faith, raising up songs of praise to God.

A few summers ago I had two different friends recommend Venice to me with



euphoric looks on their faces. This led us to spend my sabbatical in Venice and we loved what we saw. We bought a house in Pelican Pointe and are so happy to be here! On one of our first Sundays in town we visited Venice Presbyterian and knew immediately that we had found our new church home. The outstanding preaching of Pastor Chris and the beautiful music that Jamal organized brought us back each week with open and thankful hearts.

I am so looking forward to working with the choir as their interim director. What a great group of people! It's my hope that I can use my vocal experience to help them continue to grow in their singing. May we draw even closer together as fellow believers in Christ as we lead in worship.


Christmas Poinsettias donations

Music Ministry

Experience the Inspiring and Talented Ken Medema

Legally blind Christian musician Ken Medema's passion for music began at the tender age of five while playing on his mother's piano. Born in Grand Rapids Michigan in 1942, he grew up during a time when blindness was not widely accepted. Children shunned the young Medema for being different, and he spent much of his childhood alone seeking solace in music.



Medema started professional musical instruction when he was eight. Through the careful instruction of his teacher, young Medema was able to use Braille music sheets and his memory to learn the classics. He was encouraged to be innovative with his music style and his musical talent flourished. In 1969 Medema received a Master's Degree in Music Therapy from Michigan State University.

Medema began recording albums for Word and Shawnee Press in 1973, and in 1985 founded an independent recording company in Grandville Michigan. He called his new company Brier Patch Music.

By 2002 Medema had produced several albums, and presented thousands of piano and voice performances all over North America, Australia, Africa and Europe. ~ Diana Moes VandeHoef

A Sweet Story of Friendship and Ministry

Doris Heydt, a member of Venice Presbyterian Church, has had a long-standing ministry of reading to people who are unable to read for themselves, such as people in nursing homes, hospitals and retirement centers. Thanks to Pastor Carolyn, Doris was introduced to Donna Smith, also a member, who had recently suffered a stroke and lost her sight. Jane Clemmer reached out to both women so she could share their story and convey how Christ is working in our church. This is a short synopsis of their relationship as told to Jane.

I (Jane) called Doris on Tuesday and had a terrific convo with her! She is awesome and totally with it! 90 years old and as bright as a bubble!

Daris's story:

She spoke with Pastor Carolyn back in 2017 and that is how this started Carolyn hooked her up with

Donna who had had a stroke. They started meeting 2x/week for an hour each time. They would sit side-by-side and Doris would read to Donna. Reader's Digest publishes short stories and they started with this as their connection point. Since then there has been a whole series of historical novels written by Bill O'Reilly that they have enjoyed with each other. Then Covid hit and they had to stop meeting in person. Now they connect by phone for at least an hour/2 times a week. They haven't seen each other since Covid but are still connecting! Doris and Donna both live alone so they love each other's company. She has been a member of the choir at VPC for years and turned 90 on Thanksaiving Day. Doris has been dealing with health issues since 2016 and was really ill last year but has recouped! This year she is appreciating so much that the Lord has given her another

year and she is enjoying it. At the end of our conversation she said "if I can make anybody happy, I'm willing to do anything for them".

Donna's stary: (once we got into the rhythm of our conversation she was very verbal ... it was fun)

She is living in a facility full-time as a result of a stroke which resulted in her

losing complete function of her left side. She doesn't have many friends/ visitors so Doris is a special connection - a new friend from God. I asked why "reading" was special for her and she said ... "because I'm blind". They connect every Monday and Thursday for at least an hour. Donna used to usher at VPC years ago. I asked if she was being well cared for and she said, "GOD is providing very, very well for me ... my needs - not wants/wishes - but all my needs".

Both the ladies asked me to "come by and visit". :-)


Exciting news from our missionaries, Erick and Cynthia Estrada!

Oberammergau Trip: Deadline fast approaching!

For several months every 10 years, hundreds of thousands of people travel to Oberammergau, Germany, to attend performances of the village's world-famous Passion Play. The hours-long play depicts the story of Jesus's life and death, with more than 2,000 of Oberammergau's 5,000-plus townspeople participating.

In 1633, the Bubonic Plague tore through Oberammergau. In just three weeks, 84 townspeople—nearly half the village's population—died. Christian locals vowed to God that, if he would spare the rest of Oberammergau's citizens from the sickness, they would perform a Passion Play every 10 years. Legend has it that plague-related deaths in Oberammergau dropped off soon after the townspeople made that pledge, and so they kept their promise.

Villagers performed the first Passion Play in 1634. It's now performed during years that end in zero, with the exception of 1934 and 1984, when the townspeople shifted the schedule to celebrate the Passion Play's 300th and 350th anniversaries, respectively. The third exception came in 2020, when the Passion Play was postponed until 2022 because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Monthly Mission Partner, Family Promise

Family Promise of South County helps families with children get back on their feet.

Family Promise of South County is a faith-based, non-profit organization that enables the community to work together to address the needs of homeless children and families by providing temporary shelter, meals and comprehensive services to help them achieve lasting self-sufficiency.

Host congregations provide their facility for one week at a time—about once every three months. Families arrive at 5pm for dinner and stay overnight. During the day, kids go to daycare or school and parents go to work. On Sundays, the families move to the next host congregation site. Support congregations provide volunteer and financial support to host congregations.

Area Served

We help families with children — in Osprey, Nokomis, North Port, Venice, and Englewood — get back on their feet.

We provide shelter, meals, basic needs (clothing, toiletries, personal items), case management, referrals and resources. All adults meet with an Employment Consultant (to assist in job seeking/placement) and a Financial Counselor (to learn better management of finances and start a savings). We also provide them with a support system; volunteers who are there for them each day.

Each adult, once working, must disclose all income to our Case Manager who then assists them in putting anywhere from 60% to 90% of their income into a savings account. Once enough money is saved, we assist with local financial resources

for the move, and families get back into housing. (We also assist with local resources for furniture and household items they will need.)

Get to know our Scholarship Recipient: Pedro Elías Tun

Hello, my name is Pedro Elías Tun. Lam 21 vears old. I come from a humble family and live in Xaibe village in the Corozal District in Belize. My dad passed away when I was 5 years old. Fourteen people live in my house. After I finished school. I went to the Belize Adventist college. While I was working to be able to continue my study, I met Mr. Ariel Chan, who saw my need to have a job. He gave me jobs and I gradually improved myself in my studies.

Over time Mr. Ariel Chan. who is a member of the Presbyterian Church in my village, guided and advised me. He also saw the need in me to know God because I was a person who was not guided by the Holy Spirit. I was doing things that I should not do, and that God did not like. Little by little he told me to go to Mount Sinai Presbyterian Church. That is how I got to know a little more about God. It was also through Mr. Ariel Chan that I was able to have the opportunity to study in Guatemala City, for a career as a nursing

technician at Da Vinci University, and to study for a degree in biblical theology. Currently I live in the house of Dr. Erick Estrada and his wife Cynthia Chan who is the sister of Mr. Ariel Chan. That is how I had the opportunity to meet this blessed family.

They have been guiding me so that I know more about the word of God. They also looked for a person from the church where they attended to give me a baptism class and through the class, I accepted God as my Savior.

My goals are to graduate from professional nursing in kidney dialysis. I want to be able to help the poorest people who cannot obtain their medications and cannot pay the doctor's appointment. My future plan is to establish a clinic in my village to help people with low resources and to graduate from the theological seminary. I want to be a well-prepared pastor when I go back to my village so I can help in the church when the Pastor cannot give the study. I also plan to help



young people who do not know about God.

Finally, I want to ask you to help me pray for.

- 1. my family who lives in Belize because they do not know much about the word of God, and through that prayer I am asking for my family to accept God as their savior.
- 2. my studies and my health.
- for the village where I live because many young people do not know the word of God.
