We are very much aware of the presence of unethical individuals who seek to exploit our clients' data for fraudulent gain.

I can absolutely assure you that the integrity of our internal systems has not been breached and that these systems remain secure. However, any chain of security is only as strong as its weakest link. Where these criminals have been successful is not through "hacking" into any secure system, but rather by actions which amount to walking in the front door.

I have confirmed that your Realm site is currently configured with a closed invitation model, meaning that only those individuals to whom a Realm Invite is sent (by a User with Responsibilities) will be able to establish a login account. Many churches who have experienced trouble of this kind were utilizing an open invitation model, which allows anyone with their Realm site URL to register for their own account and gain access to the Directory, where they can view any addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses made visible to everyone.

Another common entry point is by using the compromised password of a legitimate user. Often times, users will utilize the same login credentials for many different websites (and rarely change them), so even if there hasn't been an actual breach of Realm's systems, a scammer may be able to gain access to Realm simply by trying out credentials which were leaked from some other system. Another method by which legitimate users' passwords become compromised is through phishing, where users are tricked into entering their valid credentials into an invalid system.

We at ACST absolutely take data security and integrity very seriously. We make every effort to ensure that our clients' information is safe, but as mentioned above, security requires everybody

We are structured so each ministry area has a team leader and a staff person responsible. The team leader works with the staff person responsible to be resourced. Ministries are not out there alone.



In what ways has Christ welcomed us, and how does this enable us to “welcome one another”? Whether you’re leading a small group, hosting friends and family, pastoring your flock, or getting to know your neighbors, consider a few ways to welcome, based on how Jesus has welcomed you:

**1. Jesus has welcomed you into the family of God. Welcome *boldly*.**

Every Christian is part of Christ’s body, the church, his hands and feet of mercy and grace in the world.

What does this mean for our ability to welcome other believers? First, it means that we are more unified with others than we are different from them because we are all members of God’s family. We can form relationships with people whom we might never have invested in previously because we are their brother or sister in Christ. Are you nervous about that new person coming to small group? Are you hesitant to talk to the person next to you at church? But we don’t need to be! If they’ve trusted Christ, they’re our family. We can welcome them boldly.

**2. Jesus has welcomed you into his mercy and grace. Welcome *unconditionally*.**

None of us have any ground for acting high and mighty, especially those in leadership roles. We are commanded to be merciful and full of grace toward sinners, which is all of us, making forgiveness and unity priority. We go out of our way to seek reconciliation; to offer the comfort of the gospel; to grieve our own sin and openly confess to other believers; and to joyfully worship Jesus together in grateful thanksgiving for what he has offered us freely. We can welcome others unconditionally.

**3. Jesus has welcomed you into his eternal inheritance. Welcome *generously*.**

Because we have all we need in Jesus, we are free to be open-handed and generous with our time, energy, gifts, resources, and finances. Because this world is not our final home, trusting that God will use this welcoming to make disciples and add to the number of those being saved. Even when we feel depleted, weak, and ill-equipped, we can trust that the Spirit will bear fruit in us for the work God gives us to do. We can welcome others generously.

## Get plugged into the A/V Booth!



Probably the most familiar piece of equipment in the A/V booth is the soundboard. This piece of equipment takes all of the microphones and manages the volume levels for the room. The sound tech is listening and turning microphones up and down to make the perfect balance in the room. When you look around the sanctuary, you'll see the large box amplifiers hanging over the chancel. Most of the room hears from these speakers. On the pillars, there are smaller white Bose speakers. These are delivering sound to the wings and supporting what you hear in the back of the room. The person sitting in the booth has to listen closely to decide if there needs to be more or less amplification at any given time.

Sounds simple enough, however we have more than 25 channels to manage on our board! The sound tech has to turn on and off the right channels at the right time. Some events are easy - only 2 or 3 microphone channels to manage. Other events require managing all of the microphone channels in one service. The sound tech follows the cues from the same sheet as the lighting, visuals, and camera techs. Just like the other positions in the booth, the sound tech has to pay close attention to what is happening on the chancel. This may come as a surprise to you, but sometimes things happen in the service that aren't on the cue sheet! It's important that whatever is happening is being supported with the correct microphones.



Our sound volunteers are only responsible for managing the sound during the service. All of the set up, entry of instruments and microphones, etc. is taken care of before the service. During the sound check, any adjustments to the sound quality and balance are adjusted. Because so much of the setup is taken care of ahead of time, the volunteer sound techs come 20 minutes or so before the service starts and are free to go after the service ends.

Have you run a soundboard before? It is an enjoyable experience as you get to see and hear everything going on in the service. Our sound volunteers are a huge blessing! Without them no event would be the same.

Happy Centennial Birthday greetings go out on August 5 for VPC's long-term unofficial "Hugger," whose career was sadly cut short last year when Covid-19 put an untimely end to not only hugging, but church gatherings as well! We all sorely miss the happy greetings and warm hugs we were accustomed to receiving whenever we met Irene Percy at church.

Irene began her life in Chicago in 1921, and lived there until she married and moved to Crystal Lake, Illinois. Her early career was as an executive secretary at a local machine company. Raising her beloved son, George, however, was her primary interest—until tragedy

hit when he was killed in an automobile accident as a teenager. Suffering through this tragedy would have tested anyone's Faith, and Irene admits that it did test hers for a time. She says her loss made her question everything she had formerly believed—until God spoke to her and called her back into his flock.

Irene moved with her husband, Wilfred Joseph—called "Bud"—



to Venice in 1970. Bud designed and built two homes in Venice Acres—one in which Irene, her step-son, Joe, and his daughter-in-law, Babs Percy now live.

The couple first joined Venice United Church of Christ, but Irene later transferred to Venice Presbyterian—where she joined Presbyterian Women and assisted in preparing and serving at the many memorial gatherings the ladies provided. Vacation Bible School could always count on Irene in the kitchen preparing snacks, and she was indispensable at the Presbyterian Women's yard sale each year—folding and displaying linens for the week.

As the moderator of Elizabeth Circle for many years, Irene received the National Presbyterian Women's "Honorary Life Membership," which is a yearly award to one woman to honor faithful service to both the women's organization and the church. Irene also regularly attended Peace River events at various member churches, their annual retreat at Day Spring Conference Center in Parrish, Presbyterian



*The first word that comes to mind when I think of Irene is LOVE. She exudes love more than anyone I know. She loves everyone and everyone loves her. John, Eli, and I have felt part of her family as soon as we met her. We were part of her "flock" and were invited to spend an afternoon with her. From that moment, we were family. 

## Mision Peniel in Immokalee is back...with some minor changes

Mision Peniel is resuming scheduling of volunteers from churches such as ours beginning in July. Our first trip is planned for Friday, October 15, and at present only 6 people at a time are needed to help with distribution of food and other items. Everything is being done on a "walk-by" basis, so mission coordinator Ruth DeYoe has asked that any donations of clothing collected must be presorted and bagged according to size. Each bag should contain

- 3 tops
- 3 bottoms

Bags need to be labeled, for example: "women's small", (with a total of 6 such items inside) Right now there's no room at the mission for storing items in bulk, so everything must be "ready-to-go" as it arrives.

They need to arrive here at the church ready to go in the order described above. The sorting and bagging must be done by the person donating. We are NOT able to do that here at the church. ## Day 4 Hope is July 31!

Day 4 Hope will have another exciting day on Saturday, July 31st where we will serve an even larger number of homeless and underprivileged children. Each year the number grows and this year we plan to serve 200 children from 100 families; in 2020 we served 164 kids. This year's event will cost over \$24,500. This would not be possible without the wonderful financial support of VPC, with assistance from our partner churches Grace United Methodist Church and New Life Church. Thank you for your giving hearts and your prayer support! Over 65 volunteers will pack backpacks, personal care bags, groceries and fruit and vegetable bags during the week, and hand them out to the families during our drive-through event on Saturday. In addition to all those supplies each child will receive, VPC will provide gift cards (\$100 per child) to buy clothes and shoes, so the children can start school on an equal basis with their peers.

Next year we hope be able to have a normal event with medical, dental and eye check-ups, haircuts and photos added to the other items we are providing this year.

We want to thank our great leadership team. We could not hold this event without all our leaders.

## **Grandparents Corner**

### **Create Great Relationships With the Parents**

Parents are the doorkeepers of the relationships with the grandkids, as they should be. But that relationship door sometimes slams in the face of grandparents. Divorce slams it. Political differences slam it. So do different spiritual paths. It's slammed by wrong decisions, unkind words said in anger, or overreactions—sometimes by the parent, sometimes by the grandpare

It's a given: grandparents who enjoy a great relationship with the parents do have access to the grandchildren; grandparents who have a broken one usually don't. It follows, then, that successful grandparents work hard to build and maintain a great relationship with the parents of their grandchildren.

### **When You Can't Talk About Jesus**

*At a seminar, one Christian grandmother told me that she wasn't allowed to talk to her grandkids about Jesus, because all three of her adult children had converted to Buddhism. She wanted advice from me, and I'm fearful that what I told her wasn't all that helpful. A few months later, I related that story to a veteran Christian counselor. He said, "Do you want to know what I would have told her?" I was all ears—I wanted to give better advice the next time. "Yes," I responded.*

*"I would have told her to start learning about Buddha."*

I was immediately impressed with his wisdom: he wasn't saying "Grandma, you need to convert to Buddhism", instead, he was saying, "Grandma, you need to try to understand."



*Trying to understand. Listening. Seeing the relationship through their eyes. Showing an interest in their interest. Being the first to ask for forgiveness—or offer it. Loving unconditionally. Those are all important strategies for a great relationship between grandparents and parents!*

*If you are a grandparent with a closed door, have hope—that door can open back up. It may take some time, a lot of effort, and plenty of prayer, but God can open it for you. It may not be until the grandchild becomes a young adult and out from under their parents' authority. But it may happen quickly if you implement a new strategy of listening, trying to understand, or initiating an honest conversation.*

*Make a great relationship with your adult children and their spouses a priority. Develop a strategy to improve it. When you are successful in that, the door to your grandchildren will open wide.*
