# Desk of Executive Director

### Dear Church Family,

We are reaching the home stretch of 2021. October 1, we begin the fourth quarter of our year.

In 2020 the Trustees decided to not have a pledge campaign for 2021 due to the complexities of COVID. We did not have Consecration Sunday and we did not ask for your commitment. We asked that you work your giving out with God. We have one quarter to go, but your gifts continue to bless VPC. We are running positive numbers and glorifying God in all we do.

Expense as of August 31 \$908,106
Net as of August 31. \$310,982

Praise be to God for the way He has worked in your hearts. Some ways your dollars have supported the ministry of VPC include the ability to begin ministry again in a very meaningful way by offering more opportunities for Bible Study both in-person and online.

We are able to have hybrid meetings due to your generosity in continuing upgrades to our AV system. This means the work of the church is not stalled but continues full force. As you know we Livestream our worship services each week. This service continues to have an impact. In August we received a note from a person at Towers of Venice saving that 12 residents gather each week to watch worship together. We gave them Worship at Home kits to enhance their time together. They are so grateful that we have this outreach to those who cannot physically get to

the church. The blessing is they have formed their own community centered around Christ.

We are revamping the library to be a great resource for you and the community as you look to grow deeper in your relationship with God. We are updating the area, books, and technology to better serve you.

Recently the Trustees made the decision to change landscaping companies. We now contract with Blue Heron Landscaping, Their first Friday morning on the property, a gentleman stopped mowing and met me on the sidewalk. I was a little startled and thought I may have gotten in his way. He was smiling from ear to ear, removed his hat, and said, "this is a joyful place and we are grateful to be here." He continued to say he finds himself praying while working here. The gentleman is from Haiti. that we just supported through your gifts during the earthquake. I shared with him how glad we are that they are here and how we just sent a large check to help his country. He was so incredibly touched he had no words. God is at work in places we cannot even imagine.

Organizations, churches, homes, and countries rise and fall on leadership. VPC is blessed to have a Nominating Committee that works hard to uphold the value of Christ-centered strong leadership. We will hold our Annual Meeting on November 7 right after church to talk about the business of the church and to elect our new leaders for Session and Trustees. I



### Study Bible Recommendation & Bible Translations

The following information and recommendations were made to the Monday Night Women's group as we begin a 24-week study of the Bible, 12 weeks in the Old Testament and 12 weeks in the New.

### **RECOMMENDED STUDY BIBLES**

It is very difficult to recommend the top study Bibles because there are so many, each with its own theme, and it is impossible to evaluate them all. Having said that, you cannot go wrong with any of these:

- 1. Life Application Study Bible (from Tyndale) in either the NIV or NLT
- 2. ESV Study Bible (from Crossway)
- 3. Cultural Backgrounds Study Bible (from Zondervan) in either NIV or NRSV

### **RECOMMENDED BIBLE TRANSLATIONS**

These are my (Pastor Carolyn's) five recommended translations for a study Bible. The UK Bible Society website has this type of information on other translations, as well.

### **New International Version (NIV)**

- Date first published: 1978 (updated in 2011)
  - What kind of translation? Attempts to adopt a midpoint between staying close to the original text and communicating its meaning in a way that is easy to understand
- Sample verse: 'If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person?' (1 John 3.17)

### **English Standard Version (ESV)**

- Date first published: 2001
  - What kind of translation? Literal, staying close to the original sentence structure but changing it where meaning is compromised. Has tried to keep some of the best-loved passages in a translation that is close to the KJV
- Sample verse: 'But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?' (1 John 3.17)

### **New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)**

- Date first published: 1989
  - What kind of translation? Formal equivalence literal, staying close to the original sentence structure but changing it where meaning is compromised. Tried hard to avoid 'male-only' language.
- Sample verse: 'How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?' (1 John 3.17)

### **New Living Translation (NLT)**

- Date first published: 1996
  - ♦ What kind of translation? Dynamic equivalence still a translation but is often very colloquial and renders the original language loosely.
- Sample verse: 'If someone has enough money to live well and sees a brother
  or sister in need but shows no compassion how can God's love be in that
  person?' (1 John 3.17)

### **New American Standard Bible (NASB)**

- Date first published: 1971 (updated in 1995)
  - What kind of translation? Very literal, as close to the original sentence structure as possible. Considered by many to be the 'most literal' translation
- Sample verse: 'But whoever has the world's goods, and sees his brother in need and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him?' (1 John 3.17)

### **BEST ADVICE: READ MULTIPLE TRANSLATIONS**

There are so many Bible translations. Which one should you choose? I personally like the advice in an article on The Gospel Coalition's website by Andy Naselli, "How Not to Argue About Which Bible Translation Is Best." Andy is associate professor of systematic theology and New Testament for Bethlehem College & Seminary in Minneapolis and one of the pastors of Bethlehem Baptist Church.

### Andy's recommendations are:

- Regularly benefit from the strengths of multiple translations. It is not a
  question of either/or but both/and. There is much to be gained by reading in
  multiple translations.
- 2. Don't overestimate your ability to translate the Bible into English. There are subtleties and connotations in every language that make it impossible to translate exactly. (Thus all translations are also interpretations).
- 3. Thank God for good Bible translators and translations. Bible translation is complex, and high-quality translation requires a massive amount of training

- and skill and experience. Respect the major translation philosophies and enjoy the benefits of multiple translations.
- 4. Be careful when you criticize a translation. Here Naselli displays a cartoon that shows someone speaking to a group of people. He says to them, "90 scholars with 11 PhD's apiece spent 25 years translating this passage, but today I'm going to tell you what the original Greek REALLY says."
- 5. Recognize your monolingual bias (if you have one). Andy tells about Dave Brunn, who spent more than 20 years in Papua New Guinea serving the Lamogai people through church planting, literacy training, and Bible translation and he notes: "God speaks in languages other than English."
- 6. Recognize how similar English Bible translations are. Every version translates thought for thought rather than word for word in many contexts. Every version gives priority to meaning over form. Every version steps away from the original form in order to be grammatically correct in English.

### RECOMMENDED RIRI E STUDY WERSITES

There are about a zillion Bible and Bible study websites. The best way to know if you can trust any one of them is to be like the Berean church and search the Scriptures yourself "to see if these things are so." Here are four that I (Pastor Carolyn) recommend and personally use all the time.

### www.biblegateway.com

Designed to allow easy reading, listening, studying, searching, and sharing of the Bible in many different versions and translations, including English, French, Spanish, and other languages. Easiest to use to search by word or phrase. Easiest to use for an entire passage.

### www.biblehub.com

Features topical, Greek and Hebrew study tools, plus concordances, commentaries, dictionaries, sermons and devotionals. When a Bible verse is displayed. click on "Interlin" in the heading and you will get the original Greek or Hebrew along with the grammatical construct. Then click on any word in the verse and it will go to a page that shows more detail including where all that word shows up in the Bible, bible dictionary, commentaries, etc. It can get pretty technical, but explore!

Blue Letter Bible provides powerful tools for an in-depth study of God's Word through a free online reference library, with study tools that are grounded in the historical, conservative Christian faith.

### **Preganacy Solutions' Impact**

Recently, one of our Rookie Dad volunteers was taking out the trash when he noticed a man in our parking lot. At seventy-something years of age, this man didn't look like our usual clientele. Our volunteer greeted the gentleman and asked if he could be of any assistance. They entered the center exchanging pleasantries and made their way to the

Rookie Dad room. conversation The shifted to the reason for his visit. This gentleman had fifty-year-old secret and was buckling under the weight of it. When he was a very young man, his girlfriend had chosen to abort their child. For all this time, this had weighed on him, casting shadows

of grief, anger, guilt and shame on his otherwise happy life. How wonderful that in this moment, out of all of our volunteers, the one who was present that day was one from the same generation, who had experienced life through a similar lens. How humbling it is when we see God's hand in our work. This man's visit served as a powerful reminder of the devastating and lasting effects of abortion and the importance of our work in ending the demand for abortion in our community. What an honor it is to walk with our clients, sharing in their burdens and shepherding them to the one who can heal every wound! This gentleman is now walking through healing.

This year already, we have opened two new centers, 34 babies have been saved, 164 moms and dads have participated in our Earn While You Learn Program and 614 clients have walked through our doors! Every one of these numbers represents an individual's life that has been forever changed. We continually pray the Prayer of Jabez over

our centers and God truly is blessing us and expanding our borders. Our goal is to continue to meet the need by expanding our office hours, expanding our reach to the youth in our communities, expanding our reach within our Rookie Dads Program and opening up a new location in Arcadia in 2022!

Six years ago, a client walked into our center feeling completely defeated. She did not feel she was prepared to be a mom, was not sure who the father was and was actively drinking and smoking. Through many hard appointments and conversations with our client advocates, our client chose life! Shortly after choosing life, she moved out of state where she had more family support. This past month. this client walked back into our center to thank us for helping her see the miracle of birth. She has since rededicated her life to Christ, married the man of her dreams, and her husband is in the process of adopting her son. Each day we get to celebrate these wins because of your support!

### **HELPS Stove Team**

VPC partners with Helps International and the people of Guatemala to foster hope and health through the placement of water filters and and safe, efficient stoves in homes and schools.

For centuries, people in third world countries have cooked using open fires on the floors of their small homes. This is the cause of medical and environmental problems:

- burns
- severe respiratory problems
- · air pollution
- · rapid deforestation

The Onil stove was developed in recognition of these problems. Being raised off the floor and vented, it drastically reduces the risk for burns and smoke inhalation. Ecologically, it is 70% more efficient than an open fire thereby decreasing deforestation

and greenhouse gases, plus saving money or time spent in gathering firewood.

If you would like to join the stove team, dates are March 12 - 21, 2022. It is possible that Covid will again interfere with our going. We just cannot know but we are becoming fully prepared including fulfilling the requirement for each team member to be fully vaccinated.

In addition to the joy of installing stoves and water filters in homes, we will deliver small gifts to the children at the Helps school supported by members of our congregation, knitted goods from Knit One Pray Too for newborns and infants, and medical supplies to the neighboring clinic.


