

Dear Church Family,

Welcome to 2022. Many of us begin a new year with resolutions that "this year will be different". We will lose the weight, exercise 5 days a week, drink gallons of water, be more intentional in my time with God. Within a week we are right back to our habits of dessert every night while sitting on the couch drinking soda.

Thinking about the why behind the what can be helpful as we begin the new year. Deciding on what is important to you as you find ways to balance your life spiritually, mentally, emotionally and physically. Why do you want to lose the weight? Why do you want to be more physically active? Why do you want to renew your heart with God? Why do you care about emotional, physical, spiritual, and mental health?

Sometimes we get so caught up in what the world tells us we should look like and feel like that we forget to understand ourselves enough to figure out why we want to be a better version of ourselves. Romans 12:2 challenges us to "not conform to the patten of this world, but be TRANSFORMED by the RENEWING of your mind". God calls us to challenge our thinking and stay grounded in Him.

A great way to get started in 2022 might be some time of reflection on our habits, starting slow with attainable goals, and being accountable to our decisions. For example, why do you want to achieve spiritual, physically, mental, and emotional balance?

A place to explore might be what is your foundation? What are your spiritual roots? Why do you believe what you believe? Is it because you were raised that way or did you explore your spiritual feelings, emotions, beliefs, actions for yourself. At times, we focus so much on our outward appearance that we forget what is reflected on the outside begins on the inside. 

Donation Policy for non-monetary goods and items

We are so blessed to have a congregation of generous and selfless people. And



All donations (regardless of size and value) must be approved before being brought to the church property.

Once donations of items have been given to and accepted by the church:

- All donations will be under complete control of the church and may be used at the church's discretion. The church will make all decisions on use, placement, disposal, etc. of the donated item(s).
- Items cannot be reclaimed by the giver once given to the church, they are property of the church.
- Items cannot be given to the church for the purpose of holding/storing until a time they want to reclaim them.
- Donated items may not be removed from Church property without permission of administration.

Exceptions may be made according to a need or desire of a ministry area. Approval must be obtained before donation is made.

Careful considerations before donating (if these apply, please consider NOT donating)

- If an item holds a high sentimental value
- If an item is of monetary value that you wish to make decisions regarding
- If there is an item you would like to regulate usage of or control the placement

The Heart of Stephen Ministry



Worship Ministry

Two Services Begin Sunday, January 9

During this transitional time in our music ministry, we will be offering two complementing styles of worship services – both traditional in many ways, but with some stylistic differences. Both services will feature the same message and the same basic outline.

9 AM, Reflective, contemplative worship

This service will be a simple and sacred time of worship, inviting worshippers to a spirit of quiet reflection in our candle-lit sanctuary. We will sing traditional hymns (generally accompanied by piano), and meditative music will be offered by instrumentalists.

11 AM, Classic traditional worship

This service will generally include more music, led by choir and the majestic pipe organ. The pastors will typically wear robes, and worship will include more liturgy.

Malachi 3:3 - Refiner of Silver

Malachi 3:3 says: "He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver."

This verse puzzled some women in a Bible study and they wondered what this statement meant about the character and nature of God.

One of the women offered to find out the process of refining silver and get back to the group at the next Bible Study.



That week, the woman called a silversmith and made an appointment to watch him at work. She didn't mention anything about the reason for her interest beyond her curiosity about the process of refining silver. As she watched the silversmith, he held a piece of silver over the fire and let it heat up. He explained that in refining silver, one needed to hold the silver in the middle of the fire where the flames were hottest to burn away all the impurities.

The woman thought about God holding us in such a hot spot and then she thought again about the verse that says: "He sits as a refiner and purifier of silver." She asked the silversmith if it was true that he had to sit there in front of the fire the whole time the silver was being refined. The man answered that yes, he not only had to sit there holding the silver, but he had to keep his eyes on the silver the entire time it was in the fire. If the silver was left a moment too long in the flames, it would be destroyed.

The woman was silent for a moment. Then she asked the silversmith, "How do you know when the silver is fully refined?" He smiled at her and answered, "Oh, that's easy – when I see my image in it."

If today you are feeling the heat of the fire, remember that God has His eye on you and will keep watching you until He sees His image in you.

Missions

MMP: Haiti Educational Foundation

The mission of the Haiti Education Foundation is to provide educational opportunities to children in the mountains of southern Haiti.

In 1977, Dr. Gardner and Mrs. Frances Landers of El Dorado, Arkansas heard about the desperate medical needs of the Haitian people. They volunteered to help and eventually developed a routine of making two trips a year to the impoverished island. Together with their surgical team, they provided sight-renewing surgery and eyeglasses to thousands of people.

On a trip in 1981, Frances overheard Father Jean-Wilfrid Albert reluctantly tell a heartbroken child that there was no room for her in the mission school. That incident inspired Mrs. Landers to do something to ensure that the priest could say yes to children asking for a chance to learn.

Armed with photos of several hopeful children, the Landers returned to El Dorado and raised enough money through her church, her family, and her friends to build and operate an 8-room school at Mercery village and to set up 3 small schools in nearby mountain communities.

Haiti Education Foundation has grown in to 34 elementary and 6 high schools educating over 7,000 students

From one woman's effort and one small school in 1981, the Haiti Education Foundation has grown in to 34 elementary and 6 high schools educating over 7,000 students. Through the



schools, these children will be able to learn to read, write, and learn a trade which will help them and their families out of the poverty that runs rampant across the island.

The primary goal is to fund the students' scholarships, but also been working to rebuild or repair two-thirds of the schools impacted by the 2010 earthquake. The replacement schools and all future structures are being built to earthquake and hurricane-resistant standards. They are also raising donations to provide school supplies, pay teachers' salaries, and furnish schools with desks and chairs. 100% of donations go directly to Haiti, with nothing deducted for administrative fees. The team of volunteers works diligently to ensure that every dollar is accounted for and goes towards its intended purchase.

Get to know our Scholarship Recipient: Anna Pauc Vasquez



I will begin by thanking VPC for the scholarship that you gave me. God has plans for my life and your scholarship is helping me do God's work.

I will never stop thanking God for everything he has done in my life. There are things that I never imagined having. When I was 8 years old, my father passed away and from that moment I began to see the hand of God in my life. He never left me or my family. In the most difficult moments, he was there with us. Sometime later, my mother was detected with cancer and God never left us. There were people that God put in our lives to help us. They helped my mother with everything, but God had other plans for my brothers and me. My mother passed away when I was 12 years old. We had nothing to survive. We were children and did not know what we were going to face. But there was God giving us his peace, in those dark times. And out of nowhere a family appeared. We did not know them or anything about them, but they accepted us into their home. I remember that first day we came. They bathed us and gave us clothes and food. Everything was new. It was as if we were born again, but this time we had a new dad and a new mom. (A curious fact is that my current mother has many characteristics of my blood mother. And I don't remember much about my father). They have helped me a lot from the moment I arrived.

Now I am 25 years old, and I have many plans for my future, but first I want to graduate as an optometry technician. I am very close to it. I want to get my degree so that I can start my clinic and help the people who need it most. I want to feel the satisfaction of me being able help someone and also helping in my father's clinic. I feel that it is the only way I can repay for all that they have given me.

I ask for prayers so that in this semester I will understand everything I have to study. Right now, I am in the 4th cycle and I would only need the 5th cycle. Also, I ask for a closer relationship with God that it is more and intimate.


